Background

It is known that Black and Ethnic minority (BME) doctors in the NHS do not do well in Exams, excellence awards or career progression. They are also reported to the GMC in significantly more numbers. The Local BME graduates also have similar problems although not to the same extent as International Medical Graduates (IMG).

A lot of research has been done over last 30 years or so to analyse the underlying reasons, and whilst

recognising the complexity of the issue and the need for more research to better understand the reasons, it is clear that there is a failure to implement some well -known solutions.

Aims and Objectives
